- Be Versatile The easier you can shift gears from department to department the easier it'll be to assist ALL.

Stock Market Game:

- Familiarize yourself with the resources before starting. There are many resources, so narrowing it down to what you want for your classes would be best.
- Have designated SMG days for lessons/group work, etc., and let students check their portfolios daily (5-10 min).
- Arrange for a speaker from Invest It Forward to come speak to your class. Do this ahead of time, because (according to the site) it might take awhile to get a speaker.

VE-JV 7th Grade:

- Dedicate the first week or so to getting students technologically comfortable and organized (Organizing their Browser, Google Drive folders, navigating Canvas)
- If certifying, send home a parent letter (and have it ready at open house) listing all the digital resources/usernames-passwords your students will need in order to succeed. Have this letter signed and returned.
- ▶ Visit VE firms on the Firm site to start getting ideas for next year.
- Engage in team building activities!!

- Set Up a Mentorship Program. Have the 8th graders work directly with the 7th graders a several times a month depending on schedule.
- Identify Fundraising Opportunities for the 8th Grade Program. To cover VE-related expenses throughout the year (trade show booth decorations, travel to corporate offices, competitions).
- Hold a School-wide Event to Showcase VE-JV. Bring awareness to the school community (and outside stakeholders) by holding a school-wide event where students might deliver their pitch presentations.
- Recommended Sequencing of Work/Projects After Trade Show
 - Reflection tasks
 - Personal finance tasks
 - Rebrand the company
 - Preparation for competitions
 - Personal branding exercise
- Establish Relationships with Business Partners. This allows students to meet and interact with business partners. students to shadow adults working in the same department as the students and use them as a resource as the students work through the curriculum.
- Schedule Visits to Other VE Firms to Observe Best Practices.
- **Develop Additional Video Production Projects.**

Certification Testing & VE-JV

- Drill and practice opening, viewing, saving and uploading documents in canvas ... it becomes second nature for the students
- Practice, practice, practice for exam prep
- Students should achieve 90% and above for all practice exams before moving on to the real test.
